Rules of the Rex Park

- The Rex Park is open sunrise to sunset.
- All persons are entering and using the park at their own risk.
- No more than two dogs per person allowed at one time.
- Do not allow unlicensed dogs into Rex Park.
- Only enter through the entrance of the Rex Park.
- All members of Rex Park must follow traffic and parking regulations of the Lions parking lot.
- Dogs must be on a leash until entering the dog park and when returning to the parking lot, no exceptions.
- Please remove pinch and spike collars from your dog prior to entering the dog park.
- Dogs must wear their current license tag and be up-to-date on shots (parvo/distemper/rabies).
- Proof of current rabies vaccination and valid rabies vaccination tag number for each dog registered.
- Carry a leash at all times and leash your dog at the first sign of aggression.
- Direct supervision & voice control of your dog(s) is required at all times.
- No females in heat allowed in Rex Park and no puppies under the age of 6 months.
- Children under the age of 16 must be supervised by an adult and behave appropriately.
- For safety reasons children must be closely supervised by an adult at all times. Children will be expected to behave in an appropriate manner: no running, no chasing dogs, no petting of other dogs unless permission is granted from the owner first.
- Do not bring rawhide or food into the park as dog fights may result.
- Be polite: pick up dog feces and dispose of the dog feces in the waste receptacles, which are available throughout the park. Failure to pick up after your dog could result in a \$250.00 fine.
- Fill in any holes your dog(s) digs throughout the dog park.
- Watch your step. Dog(s) running at play can unintentionally collide with park users.
- No dogs known to be aggressive toward other dogs or people may enter the dog park.
- Reports of an aggressive dog must be substantiated and will be investigated.
- To report an incident or if Police assistance is needed call 262-245-2710.
- Users of this park do so at their own risk. The Williams Bay Recreation Department shall not be liable for any injury or damages sustained in this park. Dog owners are legally responsible for their dog's actions, and are liable for any injuries caused to their dog.
- Failure to abide by the rules and/or regulations set forth at the Rex Park can result in a warning, suspension, fine or revocation of Dog Park Membership.

Dog Licensing - Wisconsin State Law and Village Ordinance requires that you obtain a dog license for your pet unless it is less than five (5) months old. The Village will strictly enforce this law. It is your responsibility to obtain this license. Licenses can be picked up at the Village Clerk's Office during regular business hours. You must provide your pet's: Current rabies certificate proving vaccination. Proof of pet having been spayed/neutered **Cost** - Unaltered Pet: \$30.00, Altered Pet: \$11.00. Any person purchasing a dog license for a dog 5 months of age or over after April 1 shall pay an additional late fee of \$5. When an application is sent to the Recreation Department we will check with the Police Department to make sure that the dog owner has a current license. If the application is nonresident we would ask for the certificates from each dog owner.

Scoop Law - Village Ordinance calls for an owner to have in their possession a scoop, bag or other device designed to pick up and remove animal waste from public or private property (other than property of the owner).
